# Troop 17

Things to keep in mind while packing.

Scotland is still a little chilly in July, with temperatures ranging from 49°F to 63 °F. The U.K. is known for its rainy days AND anyone who has ever camped with Troop 17 knows to expect to get wet.

The scouts will be carrying their gear over short distances, so keeping the weight down is important. Remember, we will be washing clothes at local launderettes along the way.

All Items should have your scout's name marked on them.

There is a now famous story of a T17 scout who on the last international trip, left his Ipad at the airport. Don't be 'That Scout'. Limit the number of electronics.

The Scouts will need a large duffle bag, a large backpack and a small day-pack. The large back pack will actually be placed into the duffle bag, to be checked onto the plane. Please note that the troop has many large backpacks to loan or give out.

# Arrive at the airport with the following on your person

- o Passport
- o Travel Wallet with School ID, Cash, Travelers debit cards
- A wrist watch (Very Important!)
- Troop 17 Cap
- Troop 17 Neckerchief
- Official BSA short sleeve scout shirt with correct badges.
- Official BSA Shorts
- Official BSA scout belt
- Official Troop 17 red-topped socks
- A pair of hiking (over the ankle) boots

# Small day pack (to be carried on board the plane)

- Pack a lunch to be eaten on the plane. Drinks will not be allowed through security, so they will be purchased on the terminal side.
- Medications in original bottles, with copies of prescriptions; Give to the Travel Master Mr. Johnson for safekeeping.
- Empty Nalgene (Must be empty at Airport)
- Camera with extra batteries & memory
- Pen/pencil/notebook journal
- 5 small ziplocks (to keep important small things dry)
- An extra pair of glasses if you wear glasses or contacts
- Plastic camping spoon/fork, Bowl, Cup
- Headlamp & extra batteries
- (Optional) Smart Phone (check European Rates & Usage); don't forget to bring a Power cord and a United Kingdom Power compatible USB Strip, waterproof bag/case.
- (Optional) entertainment; deck of cards, fidget spinners, reading material (keep it light)
- o (Optional) Sunglasses

• A large duffle bag (which you will put your backpack into to check onto the plane)
